Parent Education: "How to Talk to Your Children About Race and Racism"

As many of you know, we were able complete our school's <u>first strategic</u> <u>plan</u> at the end of last school year. "Belonging" was one of the four strategic pillars our community identified as crucial to our organizational growth. Our charge for the next five years is to "deepen our commitment to inclusion so that everyone in our community feels a sense of belonging." As we begin to embark upon this important work, we are excited to welcome Dr. Allison Briscoe-Smith, Ph.D on next Tuesday, November 16, to facilitate a Park Day community discussion about <u>"How to Talk to Your Children About Race</u> <u>and Racism"</u>. Dr. Smith will facilitate this community space over Zoom anchored in the following three questions:

- 1. Why should I talk to my children about race? Doesn't this create divisions?
- 2. When is the right developmental time/age to discuss race with my child?
- 3. How should I approach this topic that is fraught with trauma and emotion?

We ask you to **submit any additional questions ahead of time** so that Dr. Smith can shape and refine her time with us.

Dr. Briscoe-Smith earned her undergraduate degree from Harvard University. She then received her clinical psychology Ph.D. from University of California Berkeley. She then went on to continue her specialization in trauma and ethnic minority mental health through internship and postdoctoral work at University of California San Francisco/San Francisco General Hospital.

She has combined her love of teaching and advocacy by serving as a professor and by directing mental health programs for children experiencing trauma, homelessness or foster care. Much of her work has been with schools, as a clinician, consultant and trainer.

Currently she is the Director of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion at the Wright Institute where she is a professor. She is also the co-author of the new book, **<u>Generation Mixed Goes to School</u>**.

As a reminder, **all students, regardless of vaccination status, need to be tested 1-3 days before returning to school following the holiday break.** To ensure the health and safety of our school community, this COVID testing is required of all students and staff regardless of any travel in or out of state. We will return to our twice-weekly onsite testing on Tuesday after break.
