Dear Park Day Families,

Today, a <u>very promising announcement</u> came out from the health officers of all nine Bay Area counties. Succinctly, because the Bay Area COVID-19 rates are steadily declining, the health officers put out a statement outlining the criteria for the eventual lifting of indoor COVID-19 masking requirements. Wow. News travels fast because I did receive a few emails and calls today from families with hopeful questions about sending their kids to school without masks!

L.K. Monroe, Alameda County Superintendent of Schools, also issued a **press release** today to provide crystal clarity:

It is important to note that this criteria currently does not apply to our school settings. Current masking mandates for TK-12 schools fall under the order of the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) and were put in place in an effort to keep schools open for in-person instruction as our youngest students have yet to qualify for vaccines. The state is set to review its masking orders for schools and provide any potential updates by November 1. The guidance and protocols provided to our schools by Alameda County Public Health Department (ACPHD) continues to be aligned with the guidance set forth by the state.

While we are all heartened by the positive momentum, we are still practicing vigilance and patience for the time being. Hold on!
