Dear Park Day Families,

This time of the year can be fraught with a sanitized retelling of American history. The traditional Thanksgiving story asks us all to turn a blind eye to the violence and near annihilation of the indigenous peoples. Because of that, I have come to refer to this upcoming break as the "Fall-iday Break."

I follow a wonderful non-profit called <u>Cinnamongirl</u> which is a leadership development organization that creates bonds between professional women of color and girls of color. Their executive director, Renee Richard, wrote a post entitled, 6 Ways to Decolonize Your Thanksgiving, that I thought would be compelling for the Park Day community.

The real origins of Thanksgiving are not as warm and fuzzy as many of us think. But there are ways to acknowledge the truth and also celebrate family, friendship, and gratitude.

- 1. Learn about the <u>specific group of indigenous people</u> whose <u>land</u> you live on.
- 2. Start a tradition of honoring them in a pre-dinner <u>acknowledgement</u> or prayer like <u>this one</u>.
- 3. Learn what they are and incorporate it into your meal or try a **dish from these Native chefs**.
- 4. Teach yourself and your family the real story of Thanksgiving.
- 5. Honor Native respect for the bounty of nature by <u>reducing food</u> <u>waste</u>.
- 6. Read books by and about Native Americans for <u>adults</u>, <u>teens and</u> tweens, and kids.

COVID TESTING RESULTS & HOLIDAY GUIDANCE

We continue to be grateful for the good health of our community. All the test results from staff and student testing this past Friday and Tuesday were negative.

As we have shared previously, **all students must have a COVID test 1-3 days before returning to school following the holiday break.** This testing is required regardless of vaccination status and any travel in or out of state.

We are adding a required question to our Titan Daily Health Screen for you to upload your student's negative test results beginning on Saturday,

November 27. Please be sure to upload the test results by Monday morning,

November 29, in order to show your green screen at drop-off. We will return to our twice-weekly onsite testing on Tuesday after break.

We wish all of our Park Day community members a wonderful and safe Falliday break. Please see the State's Holiday Gathering Fact Sheet for guidance should you choose to gather with friends and family. We are grateful that so many of our young students are getting vaccinated, and are hopeful that case rates locally will remain stable or decrease. There are many appointments available, so if you haven't already, please consider getting your student vaccinated next week.

PARK DAY WEATHER STATION

Park Day School now has its own Weather Station! Park Day parent Eric Persha (Caterina, K) and Davis Instruments generously donated the station and helped our students with the installation. Gardening Teacher, Terri Edwards-Nixon, and Director of Facilities, Jennifer Cooper, worked with Eric to help the 5th grade class learn about weather, install sensors, and brainstorm ideas for building an analog version of the weather station for our younger students. The fifth graders installed it in the Sunken Garden on Monday in Gardening class while they learned about the different components including a thermometer, anemometer and hygrometer.

Now we can monitor the weather on campus, including temperature, wind, and air quality, as well as check the weather forecast for the day, and you can, too! Just create a free account on www.weatherlink.com or download the iOS or Android WeatherLink app. Once you're logged in, search for and save the station called "Park Day School." You can also find the weather data on our website here if you scroll down.

Davis Instruments has also offered to host a fundraiser for our school community and extend a discount on their products to us as well. If you are interested in an air quality sensor for your own home or as a gift, please see this post in the Community Board group to learn more.

In the coming months students will monitor data from the station, as well as build an analog version for our younger students to use and make observations.

PARKING REMINDER




