The NAIS People of Color Conference (PoCC) is the flagship of the National Association of Independent Schools' (NAIS) commitment to equity and justice in teaching, learning, and organizational development. **This annual conference happens every year during the first week of December and this year, we have 13 Park Day School staff in attendance for this virtual experience.**

With a rich history spanning more than 30 years, PoCC is unique among professional development experiences in the national education landscape. PoCC supports the complex dynamics of independent school life and culture and the varied roles people of color play and experience in these settings. The mission of the conference is to provide a safe space for leadership, professional development, and networking for people of color and allies of all backgrounds in independent schools.

This year's PoCC guiding theme is <u>Reckoning with Impacts, Rolling with Just</u> <u>Intent.</u> The focus of the keynote speakers, affinity spaces, and workshops is acknowledging responsibility and taking principled action to redress wrongs with a call to character and courage and an underpinning of creating spaces of belonging in independent schools.

Park Day's 13 staff attendees have committed to attend a broad range of workshops/sessions in order to bring back wisdom, ideas, and paths forward to our school community. Stay tuned.

We are closely tracking the impact of the new Omicron variant, and will continue to practice the prevention measures that have kept our students and staff safe during the pandemic.

"We need to use the tools we already have to prevent transmission and save lives from Delta. And if we do that, we will also prevent transmission and save lives from Omicron," said Dr. Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, the WHO directorgeneral, in a briefing on the new variant Wednesday.

We are heartened to hear that so many of our students are receiving their COVID vaccines, and that case rates locally are remaining relatively low for now. We strongly encourage all students to be vaccinated, especially with the variant and family gatherings and travel during the holiday season.
