

COVID UPDATE


Things are looking up as COVID case rates are going down! We are happy to report that all of the on campus PCR test results from Tuesday are negative, and there are no students or staff out with COVID. While the State and County are lifting indoor mask restrictions next week, masks are still required in schools.

Thank you to everyone who has completed the <u>Rapid Antigen Testing Consent</u> <u>Form</u> through ParentSquare. If you haven't yet, please complete the form by tomorrow, Friday, February 11, so that we can continue to provide this service and keep students safe, healthy, and on campus.

Note that in an abundance of caution, we will be requiring all students to submit a negative COVID test result at the end of February break, similar to what was expected after Winter Break. PCR or Rapid Antigen test results can be uploaded through Titan on February 27-28.

If you are unable to find a rapid test or test appointment, please contact Cassandra McCraw in the main office (510-653-0317) as we have a small supply of at-home rapid tests available. More reminders will be forthcoming.

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BEING GOOD NEIGHBORS

Please be mindful of our neighbors when dropping off and picking up your student. We've recently heard from neighbors on Opal Street, 42nd Street, and 43rd Street frustrated by Park Day families blocking their driveways and parking illegally during drop-off and pick-up times.

Maintaining a good relationship with our neighbors is important for our school, and practicing good behavior when it comes to parking is the least we can do for our community. Here are some guidelines to keep in mind:

- Please approach Park Day on 42nd Street from Broadway
- Please use the drive through lane when dropping off or picking up
- Please pull through and circle the block if your student is not ready when you arrive to keep traffic moving
- Please do not to block through traffic from either direction along 42nd
 Street
- Find legal street parking in the neighborhood if you choose to walk into campus
- As a special request due to traffic congestion, we ask that you do not park on 43rd Street at all
