PROGRAM SNAPSHOTS

Lower School:

Classrooms are in full swing as we wind up our fourth week of school. Students are building connections and community by sharing aspects of their identity with one another in various ways. In fifth grade, "identity icebreakers" have given students an opportunity to share family photos, descriptive words about themselves and family traditions.



Second and fifth graders are participating in the New Georgia Project, <u>Lift</u> <u>Every Vote's Good Trouble Postcard Project</u>. Kids are learning about the importance of voting and helping get the word out to unregistered voters, while also learning about the legacy of John Lewis. Their postcards are personalized to the recipient. Students love to make a difference and be activists in their community, and we are always looking for opportunities to foster their engagement.



Students in all grades are also learning about the legacy of Ruth Bader Ginsberg. Fourth and fifth graders are learning about her many achievements and contributions to women and marginalized communities, and also reflecting on and discussing some of her most famous quotes. Fifth graders used a jamboard to add their thoughts to "Fight for the things you care about, but do it in a way that will lead others to join you." Fourth graders are using art to respond to "Real change, enduring change, happens one step at a time." Students in several grades heard the book "I Dissent" and responded through writing with their own ideas about things they'd like to change, and also interacted with a virtual RBG room with links to explore to learn more about her life.

Now that students are back in the swing of school, teachers are also launching several assessments in math through our Bridges in Mathematics program and in literacy to gauge students' current proficiency and their needs for use in planning and teaching.
