Dear Park Day Families,

On Tuesday evening, I had the opportunity to attend my first DJA meeting which featured Dr. **Ja'Nina Garrett-Walker** as a guest speaker. Dr. Garrett-Walker's presentation outlined her very powerful "Check Your Privilege" campaign she spearheaded at the University of San Francisco in 2014. It was an honor to be a part of that space and to learn and grapple alongside Park Day families. That night was also my first time experiencing Park Day's commitment to justice for native peoples. The DJA meeting started with a poignant acknowledgement of Park Day being on Huchiun Ohlone land that we don't rightfully own and a way to give to the Sogorea Te Land Trust through the Shuumi Land Tax.

It also just recently came to my attention that our 4th grade students completed a large scale public art mural last spring (as 3rd graders) intended to promote the Land Trust. Our Lower School Art teacher, Lisa Ostapinski, shared that this mural will be displayed in the Temescal Alley through this spring. PROGRAM SNAPSHOT

The Middle School students are showing great reliance and flexibility throughout the start of the year that is truly admirable. Every time I drop into a class, engage in a conversation and hear about the experiences of our middle schoolers, I truly smile. Across the middle school the students are engaging in learning around the political climate we are currently in as a nation as the election approaches. The students are aware of the news and what is occurring within our nation including politics, racial injustice, climate change and many more topics. It is our goal for students to not only be aware of the issues that are occurring but also are able to analyze what they see and be able to see the many perspectives of a situation and develop their own opinion.

Within 6th grade math and science the students have been diving into the US Census answering questions including "Who gets counted in the census? Why do we have a census? What happens to our houseless neighbors, do they count?". This understanding of the census was deepened through further learning about how the census impacts the population density and in turn the electoral college. Learning the backbone of the United States democratic system is giving our students a window into the political world around them.



7th and 8th grade are also diving into the world of politics and the elections through the lens of the development of the structure of United States democracy and looking at the different traditions that make up the election time, beginning with the debates. The students were able to engage in the debates of this current election cycle and compare them to the debates of the past. Upon looking at the difference in style of debate, a few 8th grade students pointed out, "It seems like debates before were actually used to hear the issues and help you make up your mind to vote, but today the debates don't seem to be used to inform you of anything." These conversations about the world they are observing also spurred discussion of age and how difficult it can be for students their age to see laws and policies being made that they understand yet they aren't old enough to be able to vote and express their voices politically at this moment.

As we get closer to election day, I encourage you to check in with your student, discuss the issues, pause to hear their perspectives and push them to empathize with, which doesn't automatically mean agree with, perspectives that are different than their own.


