I am so proud that we could put out a Park Day statement last week that was written collectively by Park Day staff.

Now, a little over a week later, there has been a second impeachment, Washington, D.C. is being turned into a fortress before our very eyes and daily new arrests are being made of those who participated in the insurrection. We are collectively watching and waiting. What we know for sure is that the only path forward for us is true accountability and justice.

After-school and Middle School Fitness Update

Thank you for completing the after-school interest survey last month. Unfortunately, there was not enough interest to enable the JCC to safely staff and run an after-school program while preserving stable cohorts within each grade level. Once the County moves back into the orange tier, and assuming current after-school interest holds or grows, the JCC and Park Day will begin work designing a program that mixes 2-3 grades per cohort. These groupings would then function as a second stable cohort as permitted by County guidance.

For Middle School families who expressed interest in fitness groups, we will also be looking at creating mixed grade groupings when we move into the orange tier. In addition, when Dean of Students and Athletic Director Ashley









Foster returns from maternity leave, she will be taking the lead on exploring grade-specific fitness groups that may be able to begin prior to our transition into the orange tier.
