"What happened?" I asked as I ran in to check on her.

"Why do they keep killing us? Another baby boy is gone. A police officer shot a 20 year old about 10 miles away from where George Floyd was murdered." My mother said in horror.

That was the scene in my childhood home in a suburb of St. Louis the first Monday of Spring Break. I felt my heart sink, my eyes welled up with tears, and the weight of another unarmed black man being killed at the hands of law enforcement permeated my being. The toxic mix of rage and grief was all too familiar. I realized that I was literally holding my breath. And, it keeps happening. Daunte Wright. Adam Toledo.

"As a black woman working in predominantly white spaces, I have been struggling with how to grieve, how to varnish my anger, how to lead, and how not to allow myself to slip into despair. Aside from my deep faith, the thing that is keeping me focused is that in my role as an educator. I get to touch the future through every teacher and student I impact."

I wrote those words to the Park Day community a few weeks after the George Floyd murder in early June of last year. I shared what was authentically in my heart. Those vulnerable words I shared then are still true. This has been hard collectively. And, this has been hard for me on a very personal level as a black woman. Yes, the recent Chauvin verdict allowed us to celebrate for a moment. Accountability is an important step. But, it is not justice.

Our next step as parents and educators is to ensure that we all do our part to prepare the next generation of true changemakers and justice seekers. Our Park Day teachers, even while remote, have created safe and age-appropriate spaces for our students (2nd-8th) to process and learn about this recent verdict and to have important conversations about accountability, justice, and what is needed for true healing
