Dear Park Day Families,

Middle school parents and educators around the country have been celebrating Monday's announcement from the Food and Drug

Administration that 12-15 year olds are now eligible to receive COVID-19 vaccinations with the expanded emergency use authorization granted to Pfizer/BioNTech. Dr. Janet Woodcock, the acting FDA commissioner said, "Parents and guardians can rest assured that the agency undertook a rigorous and thorough review of all available data, as we have with all of our COVID-19 vaccine emergency use authorizations,"

We, as a school, will not be mandating vaccinations at this time but are excited about the regained sense of normalcy that is emerging. For those of you who are interested, here are some <u>vaccine resources for families</u> seeking appointments for their children ages 12+.

Courageous Conversations

I attended a powerful workshop this week hosted by two Park Day parents, Danielle LoPresti and Akeel Williams, who also serve as cochairs of our Diversity and Justice Alliance (DJA). The topic, titled "Dear White Families, Let's Talk about Racism" addressed race, police violence aimed at black and brown people, and white privilege. In particular, we discussed practical ways white families could work to break the cycle of microaggressions and create safe and respectful spaces for their peers and classmates of color and also in our larger community.

If you missed the workshop this time around, Danielle and Akeel are supporting Park Day School's Parent Education series next year, and will host again.
