

- Students bring costumes to school that day to **change into after lunch.** Please be sure they are **labeled** with your child's name and that they can be easily slipped on over their clothes. They may come to school with some simple face paint. Please do not include any small parts that can get easily lost or any weapons as a part of their costume..
- At 1:30, students will change into costumes and gather on the field for an assembly. Each grade will "parade" in their costumes for the rest of the lower school.
- At 2:00 we'll start our Halloween booths. Each classroom sponsors a booth and teachers will reach out for a specific number of vaccinated parent volunteers to help run the booths. We'll also need some volunteers for popcorn.
- We won't be serving any sweet treats or giving prizes at the booth. The festivities and booths are the prize themselves.
- Finally, please DO NOT send Halloween candy to school for your child to eat or share with others after Halloween.
