COVID UPDATE

Dear Park Day Families,

All the PCR test results from staff and students on Tuesday were negative, as were last Friday's. We are so happy that the COVID case rates have dropped, and that we can begin to relax some of our protocols. Beginning tomorrow, March 11, we will no longer be requiring that staff, families, and students wear masks outdoors on campus. This change follows guidance from the State and County health departments and scientific research, which has shown very little risk of exposure to COVID outdoors. We are looking forward to seeing students' faces and smiles.

Out of an abundance of caution, **Park Day will continue to require masking inside all buildings on campus.** All students have received a lanyard to keep their mask handy for moving indoors and out. Students should have their mask available when they arrive on campus each morning.







REMINDERS

Parking for Drop-Off & Pick-Up

Please use the drive through lane when possible. If you choose to walk into campus, be sure to park legally and courteously for the sake of our neighbors.

Dismissal Pick-Up Windows

Please respect the pick-up window times. If you arrive

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We understand that some staff and students will need to or choose to continue to wear their mask outdoors, and we will continue to reinforce that masking is a health precaution that some may want or need to continue to do. Please talk to your student about wearing a mask and the reasons why some people need to do so.

Our other mitigation measures will stay in effect. The move from mandatory outdoor masking to optional does not signal an end to other COVID-19 protocols. This is just one area in which we are relaxing a COVID protocol. Our many other layers of safety - such as screening, improved ventilation, air purifiers, testing, modified quarantines in classrooms with positive cases, and encouraging vaccinations will stay in place. In addition, students who test positive for COVID-19 and those unvaccinated who are exposed to a positive case outside school will still need to isolate for five days before testing to return.


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BOARDWALK BUILD DAYS


