Dear Park Day families,


We're pleased to report that all Tuesday's COVID test results were negative following the break. We're grateful for our community's good health. As case rates drop, we are at a new place in the pandemic. As most of you have likely heard, the CDC, CDPH, and Alameda County Public Health Department have 3/5 lifted the universal mask mandate for K-12 schools beginning March 12.

ACPHD Health Officer Dr. Moss shared today that "Cases are declining to near pre-surge levels everywhere, and this is the right time to move face masking guidance from requirement to recommendation in most settings." Accordingly, out of an abundance of caution, Park Day will continue to require masking inside all buildings on campus at this time.

Park Day has maintained a cautious approach throughout the pandemic, and we will continue our protocols to ensure the health and safety of all staff and students. At last count our student vaccination rate is at 97% and climbing, and we have had only one new COVID case amongst staff and students in the last month. Beginning Friday, March 11, we will no longer be requiring that staff, families and students wear masks outside on campus. This change follows guidance from the State and County health departments and scientific research, which has shown very little risk of exposure to COVID outdoors.

This change will make such a positive difference for our students as they play and interact outdoors, and will allow us to see and hear each other and share smiles again! We are looking forward to the enhancement of our social-emotional connection as a community.

Masking Outdoors Will Be Optional

Wearing masks outdoors will be optional on campus because we understand that some will want or need to continue to wear masks. We will make sure that everyone understands that masking is a health precaution that some may want or need to continue to do. Please talk to your student about wearing a mask and the reasons why some people need to do so. We will use this next week to have conversations at school about respecting individual decisions.

Keeping Track of Masks

We are also aware that there will likely be issues with students losing their masks as they move from indoors to outdoors and back again. We will provide lanyards for students to attach to their masks, with a break-away feature for safety. In addition, we recently received a large number of kid-sized masks from the State that we will make available to students if they lose their mask.

Upgraded Mask Protocol Suspended

We are also suspending our upgraded mask protocol that was added during the height of the variant surges. Beginning next Monday, March 7, we will return to the standard protocol from our **COVID Safety Plan**: anyone on campus inside a building is now able to wear a cloth mask with a filter or three-ply surgical mask in addition to a KN95/N95/KF94.




BOARDWALK BUILD DAYS
